Anaphora	The repetition of words or phrases at the beginning of subsequent sentences – 'How could you lie to your mother? How could you lie to us all?'
Anadiplosis	The repetition of the word from the end of one sentence to the beginning of the next – 'When I sleep, I sleep forever!'
Antistrophe	The repetition of the same words at the end of consecutive phrases, clauses, sentences, and paragraphs – 'When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child'.
Tricolon	A series of three parallel words, phrases, or clauses – 'You are talking to a man who has laughed in the face of death, sneered at down, and chuckled at catastrophe'.
Rhetorical question	A question that is asked for mere effect, rather than a <b>question</b> that needs to be answered – 'Why would you want millions pf people to suffer?'
Chiasmus	The repetition and/or reversal of words or grammatical structure across two phrases. The concepts must be related – 'He brought the

living from the dead, and the dead from

Circular structure	Repetition of an idea, word, phrase, atmosphere at the beginning and end of a piece of writing. Something at the end of an essay that refers back to the beginning.	
Links between paragraphs	Repeat words, ideas or phrases to show that ideas are connected and there is a clear structure to your essay.	
Connectives and linking phrases	Use these to show how ideas are progressing as well as the direction of your writing.	
Topic sentences	This stares your point and identifies the main idea of the paragraph	
Range of paragraph lengths for effect	Use these as a way of organizing ideas and controlling your reader.	
Range of sentence types for effect	Use a variety of different sentences purposefully and for effect.
